These cultureal puzzles relentlessly confused the line between reality and illusion, producing public debates over the shifting boundaries of race, class, value, and truth. Cook’s highly original study takes us into the emerging mass culture where P. T. Concluding the book is a piece of historical detective work in which Reiss attempts to solve the puzzle of Heth's real identity before she met Barnum.
